Conclave Spirit Award

Each year at the Conclave Council of Chiefs, an anonymous roll-call of all lodges is taken. This roll-call is carried out by the Section chief who whispers to him the name of the lodge who he thinks has had the most Conclave spirit. A tally is taken of all votes, and the winner is given the Conclave Spirit Award for the 1996 Southern Region 7 Conclave. The criteria for eligibility are:

1. A demonstration of enthusiastic support for the lodge by its members through songs, cheers, uniforming, and support of competitive events.
2. Participation in a variety of Conclave activities.
3. A demonstration of exceptional Scout spirit through positive support. There is no room for "negative cheering" at the Conclave.

Conclave Participation Award

The Conclave Participation Award will be awarded to the lodge with the highest sum in the following categories:

A.) Section Activities:

- Program outlines for Section Planbook submitted on time 25 pts
- "Apensuwi" articles submitted on time 15 pts
- Copy of lodge charter renewal in on time 15 pts
- Council of Chiefs participation 10 pts
- Lodge calendar of events given to section secretary on time 10 pts

B.) Conclave Activities:

- Completion of assigned activity 25 pts
- Lodge placement in individual dance competition
..... 20 pts
- Lodge participation in Quest events 20 pts
- Lodge participation in ceremonies competition
..... 15 pts
- Lodge participation in team dance competition
..... 15 pts
- Judges provided for all the above(if requested)
..... 10 pts

Conclave Delegate Code of Conduct

The success of the 1996 Southern Region 7 Conclave depends highly on the behavior of its participants. Thus, there are responsibilities of which we must all be aware of in order for the Conclave to be safe, rewarding, and fun.

Accepting and standing behind the following guidelines will ensure a great 1996 Conclave for all!

I, _____, as a member of the order of the Arrow, and a participant at the 1996 Southern Region 7 Conclave, do hereby promise to uphold and follow outline Code of Conduct:

- * Observe the Scout Oath, or Promise, the Scout Law, the Explorer Code, and the Order of the Arrow Obligation;
- * Wear my official Scout uniform throughout the 1996 Conclave;
- * Attend all planned training and general sessions;
- * Be personally responsible for breakage, damage or loss of any camp, delegate, or lodge property;
- * Keep my quarters clean, my bed made, and dispose of waste in the appropriate place(s);
- * Not leave camp without approval from my lodge chief, lodge adviser, and the Section Headquarters;
- * Respect all rules regarding vehicles in camp.

I also understand further that:

- * The Trading Posts are the only sites for commercial transactions. I will not attempt to sell any items, and I will purchase only the Trading Posts;
- * I must respect all state and federal laws, including, but not limited to the use of fireworks, firearms, and gambling sites;
- * Understand that purchase, possession, or consumption of alcoholic beverages or illicit drugs is strictly prohibited;
- * I will be courteous towards other delegates, staff, and the Pipsico Scout Reservation.

Deviation from any of the above guidelines will result in the immediate removal of the delegate from the activities, or camp and possibly from the Conclave. The Conclave Planning Committee reserves the right to add or revise guidelines, decide any dispute, and any other action necessary to safety complete Conclave Operations.

Conclave Delegate Patch Trading Code

Every year, patch and memorabilia trading ranks as one of the most memorable aspects of the Conclave. To guarantee that trading is fun for everyone, the Section has created the Patch Trader's Creed. It is detailed below:

Patch Trader's Creed

As a patch trader, I will:

- * Faithfully observe the 12 points of the Scout Law;
- * Trade memorabilia only for other memorabilia while I am attending the 1996 southern Region 7 Conclave;
- * Conclave every trade with the Scout handclasp.

If you do intend memorabilia or patches at the Conclave, you must subscribe to the Patch Trader's Creed. Please be courteous and observe the rights of other Scouts and Scouters who wish to trade memorabilia.

While not as rigid as the Conclave Delegate Code of Conduct, it is still as strictly enforced, and therefore must be as solidly adhered to as any other guidelines or code of conduct.

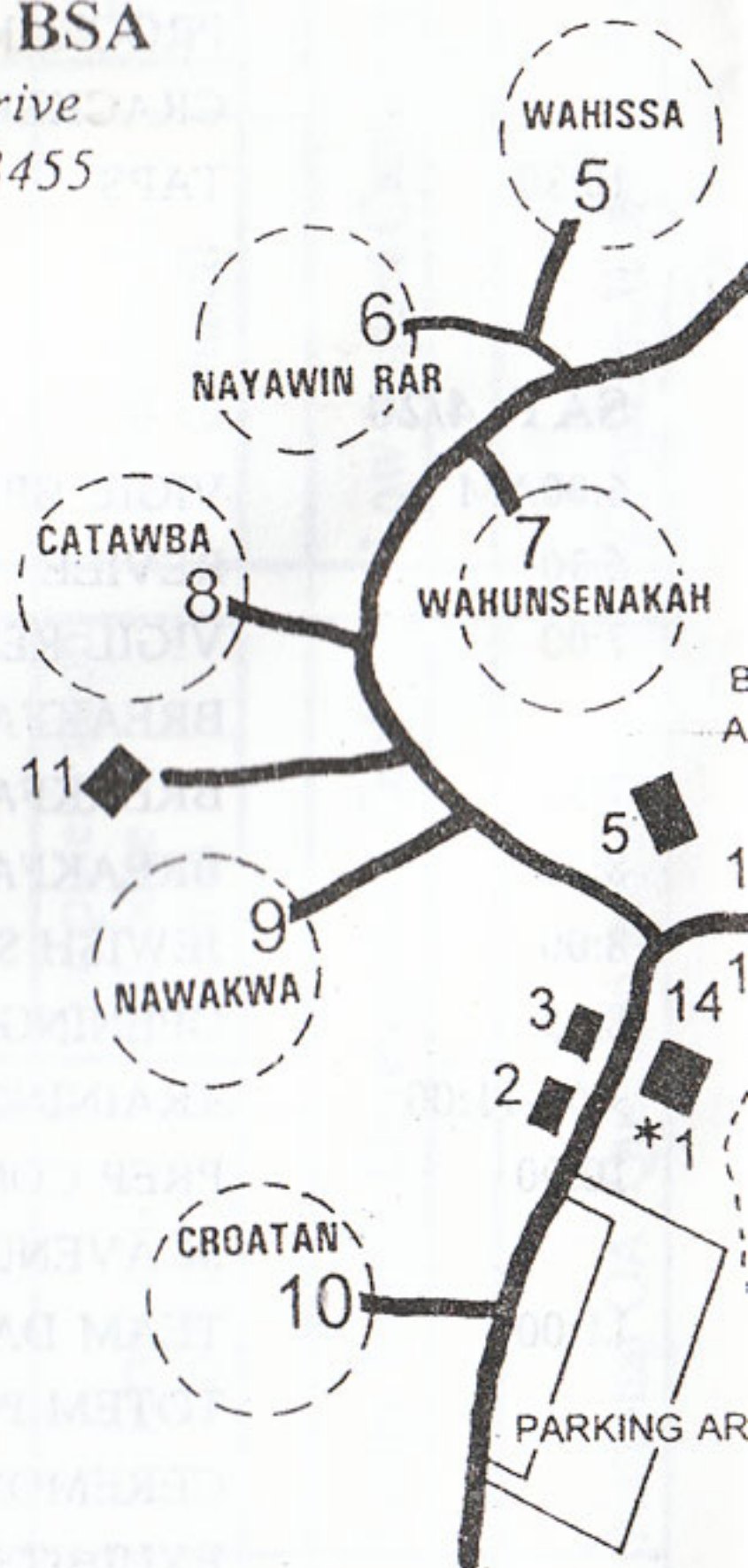

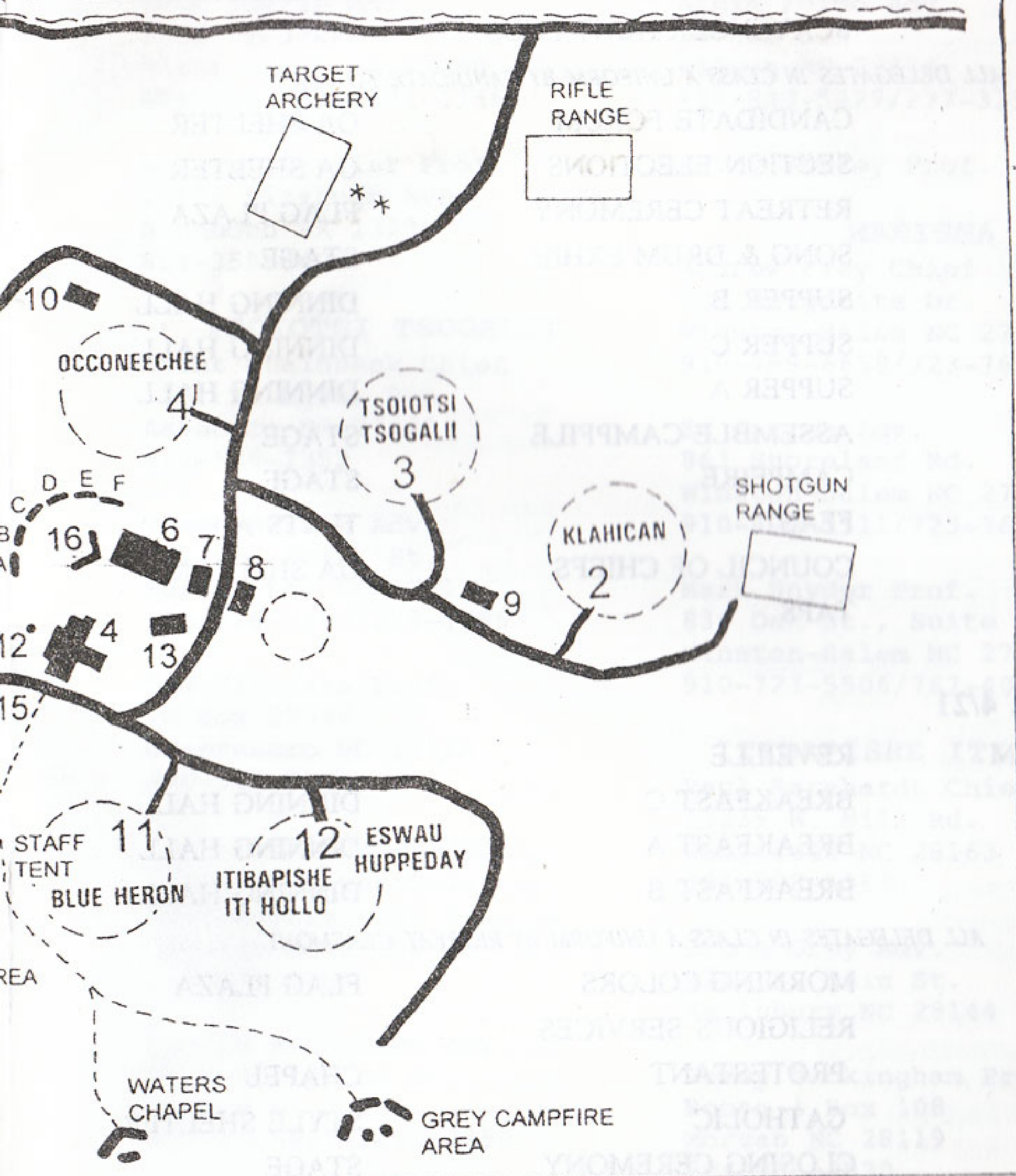

Virginia OA Section History

1921-1952 SECTION IIIA. Virginia was the southernmost state in Area III. In 1952 the Area consisted of thirty-four Councils and at least twenty-six lodges.

1952-1972. SECTION III-C. The charter members of the newly established Section were: Nawakwa #3, Nepahwin #161, Shenandoah #258, Shenshawpotoo #276, Blue Heron #349, Kecoughtan #463, Powhatan #456, Amangemek Wipit #470, Chanco #483 (joined III-C prior to the 1954 Pow-Wow)

1972-1982 SECTION SE-1 (THE NATION'S LARGEST SECTION) The new Regional realignment concept of six Regions placed Virginia in the Southeast Region. The lodges of the new SE-1 were: Nawakwa, #3, Nentico #12, Nentego #20, Tutelo #161 (a merger of Koo Ku Koo Hoo #161 and Powhatan #456) Shenandoah #258, Shenshawpotoo #276, Gunekitschick #317, Blue Heron #349, Kecoughtan, #463, Chanco #483, Amengamek Wipit #470, and Ahtoquog #540.

1982-1993 SECTION SE-8. Again, the Regional realignment resulted in a split and a renumbering of Sections; The Virginia lodges 3, 161, 258, 276, 349, 463, and 483 remained as Southeast Region lodges with the Section designation of SE-8. The Lodges of Nentico #12, Nentego #20, Gunekitschick #317, Amengamek Wipit #470 and Ahtoquog #540 were shifted to the Northeast Region and became Section NE-5.

1992- to date. The shift of the National organization again mandated shuffle of the Order of the Arrow Sections. Although the change was intended to occur prior to the 1993 Conclave, special dispensation was granted to retain the SE-7 and SE-8 Alignment until after the Conclave.

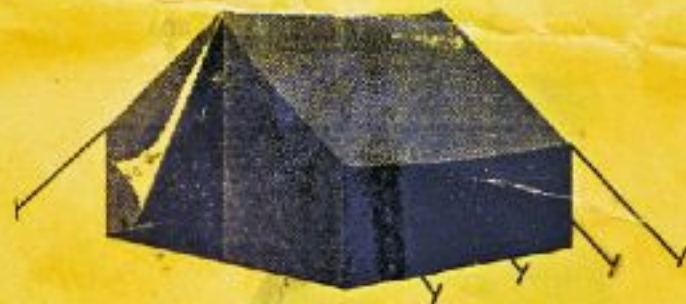
