INFORMATION & RULES

1. All vehicles must be parked in the satellite lot for the duration of the weekend. Each lodge receives one parking pass that allows the holder to park in the Camp. All other vehicles must be parked in the satellite parking lot.
2. Neither Colonial Virginia Council nor Wahunsenakah Lodge 333 will be held responsible for lost or stolen articles. Please lock your vehicles.
3. Alcohol and drugs are strictly prohibited. No personal firearms are allowed in camp.
4. Adults should not smoke in the presence of youth. Out of consideration for others, smoking is NOT allowed in camp buildings.
5. All delegates are expected to wear a class A uniform during flag ceremonies, meals and shows. A class B uniform can be worn to all other events.
6. The camp Admin Building will be staffed 24 hours a day by qualified first aid personnel. The health lodge is located in the camp Admin Building.

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7. The waterfront and maintenance areas are off-limits at all times except if used for events. Flagging will be used to mark off-limit areas. (see map of camp)
8. Camp Chickahominy rules prohibit the wearing of sheath knives on camp property. If you brought one, please leave it in your pack/car.
9. If for any reason, you have to leave the camp, you must sign out at the admin office, leaving a destination and time of return. Upon return, you are expected to check back in at the admin office.
10. Visitors should check-in at the admin office.
11. Patch trading should not occur during any training sessions.
12. Any found items may be turned in at the camp admin office where their owners may claim them.

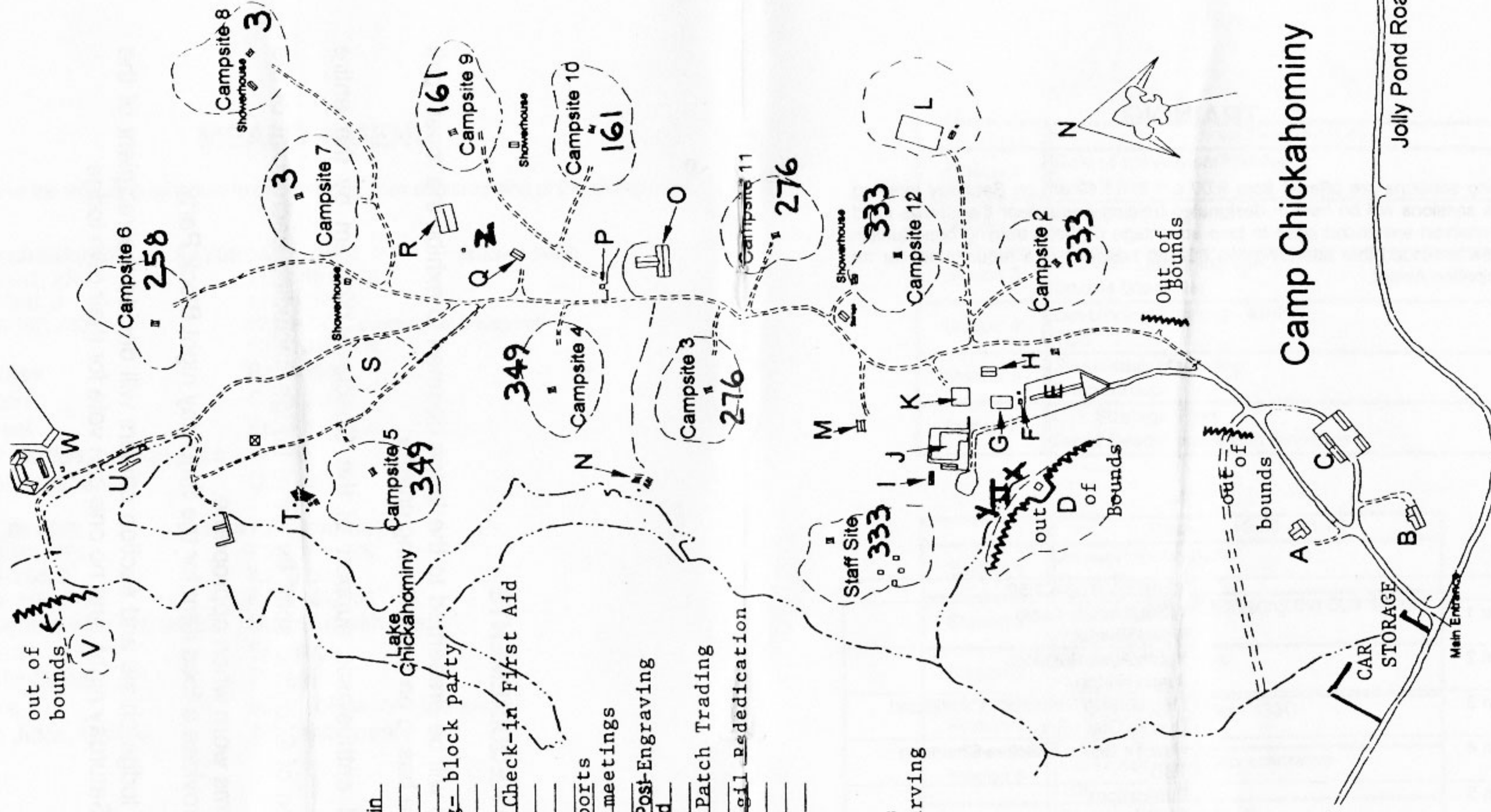

Conclave 2003 Activities

Ultimate VolleyBall: 9 on the court; maximum of one adult; unlimited number of youth with unlimited number of substitutions; teams are not forced to rotate. Rules will be similar to speed volleyball and four-way volleyball.

Requires: 1 official, 4 nets, 1 volleyball

Conclave 2003 Fear Factor: Each lodge will have a team of three members. These members are to have no obligations for the weekend, such as ceremonies competition and other activities. One adult may participate. Watch the show? That’s the rules. BE PREPARED FOR ANYTHING!

Scout Skills Extravaganza: Test you scouts’ abilities in various scouting oriented “missions.” Teams will consist of six members: two: -18, two: 18-20, and two adults.

Possible missions include fire building, knots, teamwork activities, scouting knowledge, first aid, and orienteering skills.

Requires: 5 officials, 5 stop watches

Basketball: 3 on 3. Play by 1 to 11. Win by 2. No substitutions. No three pointers. No dunks. Three age divisions: -18, 18-20, adults.

Requires: 1 official, one basketball, one basket

Tug of War: 1500 pounds max weight. No substitutions. Youth only. Best pulls out of three. Single elimination tournament.

Requires: 1 official, scale, heavy rope

Cross-Country: A point for everyone who finishes the race. Adults welcome to participate. Maximum of 10 points.

Each lodge is required to provide two officials (preferably a youth and an adult). If a lodge fails to do so, that lodge will receive a 3-point deduction from their final total for the Golden Arrow Award. All results and officials’ calls will be final.

American Indian Events

The national champion drum team hails from Wahissa Lodge in Section 7B. We have spoken with their head singer and they are willing to make the trip to sing at our Conclave. In the past we have used CDs and cassettes, this is not how it should be done! A live drum adds to the atmosphere and is the way of the Native American culture.

We are bringing in judges from outside of the section. We have several nationally ranked dancers that are willing to judge our dance competition as well as instruct training courses.

On Friday event at Conclave we are holding a busk, similar to the one at NOAC. A busk, simply put, is a showing of dance styles. We will have the judges and nationally ranked dancers in our section dance to show the proper dress and dance of the different styles.

Saturday morning we are offering many different training courses for arrowmen. This would include classes that have an overview of different styles of dance, an overview of dance clothes for the different styles, beadworking, and singing.

Saturday afternoon we will have several activities. Among these activities are tomahawk throwing, blowgun shooting, a craft competition, and the ever popular dance competition.

Saturday evening after the show we will host a section Pow Wow.
