Guidelines While Attending Conclave

- All activities will be governed by the Scout Oath and the Scout Law.
- Vehicles are restricted to designated parking areas except by special permit.
- Tobacco products are NOT allowed in Camp.
- Anyone needing special assistance should inform their Host Lodge Guide or either Camp Office.
- OPEN FIRES are restricted to the hours of 4:00 PM to 11:30 PM and limited to established campfire areas.
- Information is available at either Camp Office.
- Any emergencies should be reported to either Camp Office (each will be manned 24 hours per day).
- Trained medical personnel will be available at the CAC Health Lodge and at the CTBS Health Lodge 24 hours per day.
- Alcohol and illegal drugs (*including tobacco products for minors*) are not permitted on the Reservation.
- Adults must restrict smoking and other uses of tobacco products to areas where youth aren't present.
- Conclave dress will be the official BSA uniform ("Class A") and is required for Dinner and Shows.

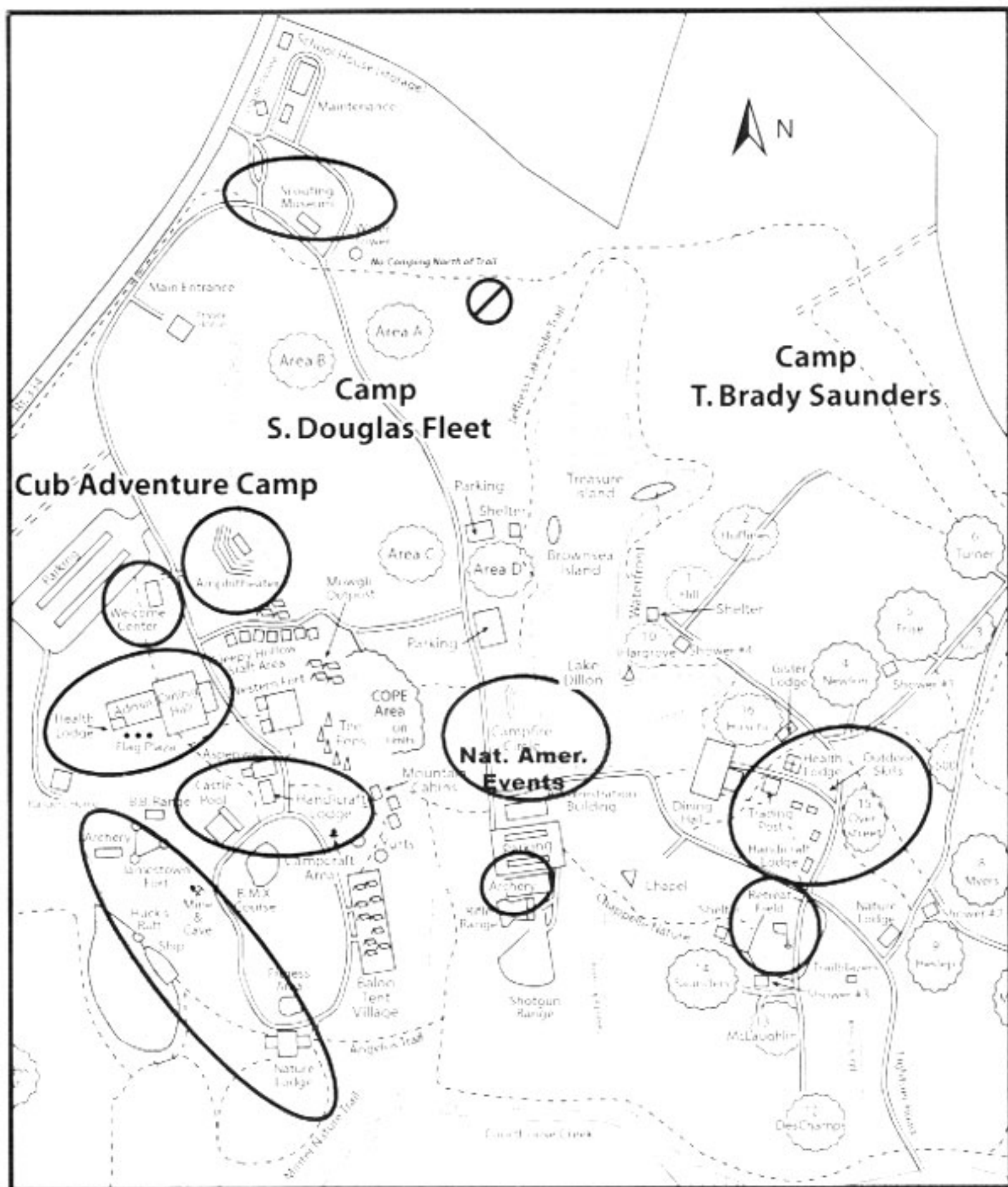

Participation Award

The Participation Award was established to recognize those Arrowmen who participate fully in Conclave. The award has been designed to complement the participant patch received by all delegates.

The awards will be available on a LODGE BASIS beginning 5:00 PM Saturday at the CTBS Administration Building. Upon completing the requirements, delegates will show their Lodge Adviser their completed tally sheets (containing six participation marks). Lodge Advisers will then obtain the necessary quantity of awards from the CTBS Administration Building and then distribute them to their delegates before the end of the Conclave.

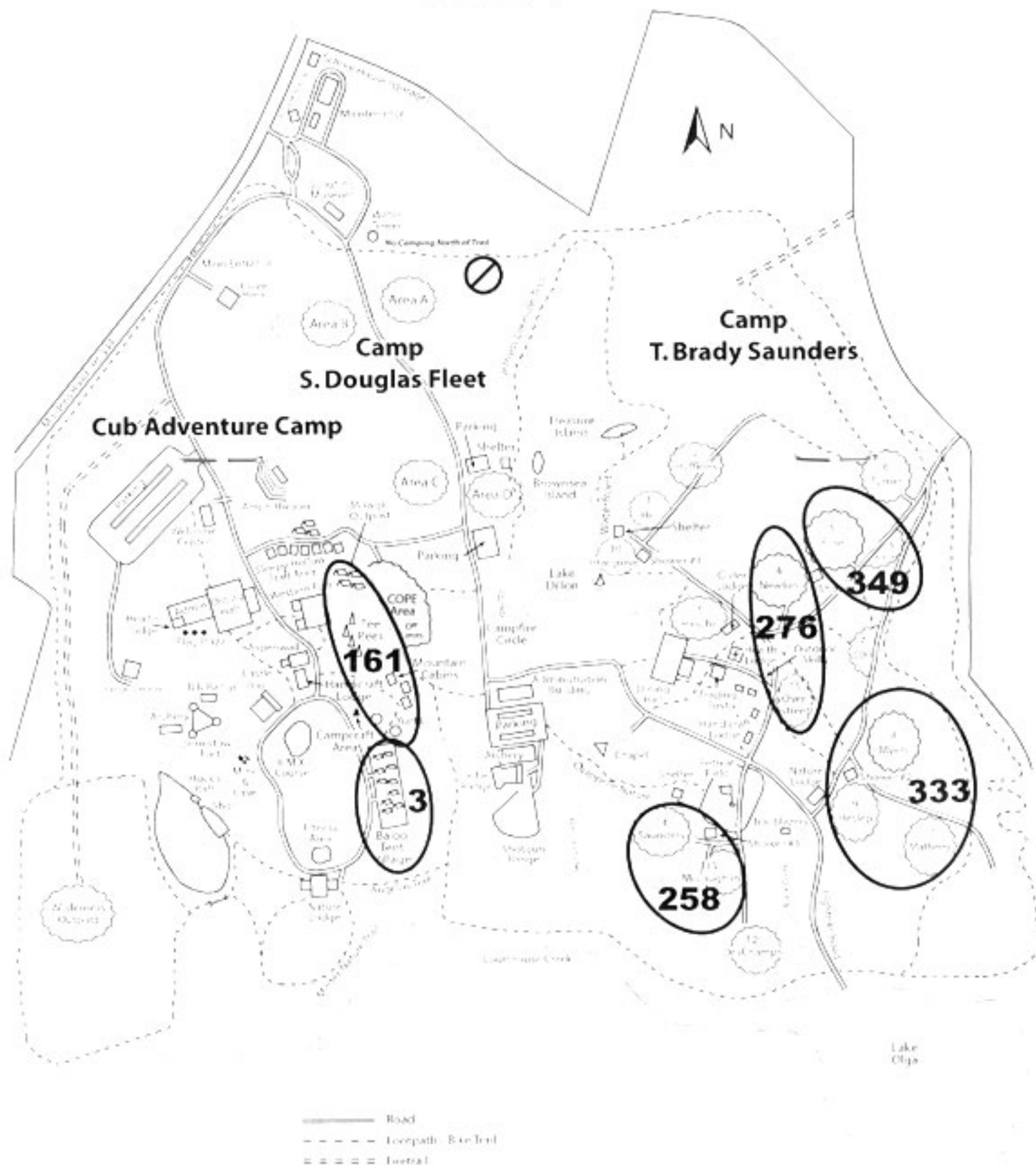

FINDING THE ARROW

- *Arrow Point: Committees (Graham Parsons — Wahunsenakah)*
Discussion about the peoples experience in the resourceful use of lodge committees.
- *Order of the Arrow Troop Representative (Corey Foster, Nate Johnson, Frankie Martin — Wahunsenakah)*
Gain understanding about duties and responsibilities of the OA Troop Reps and how they fit into the Order
- *The Trail to Brotherhood (Chief Taylor Bobrow — Blue Heron)*
A discussion with Ordeal members about the steps to sealing their membership in the OA and its importance
- *Arrow Point: The Chapter — Mission to Reality (Joey Trask — Wahunsenakah)*
The chapter is the most fundamental and important part of the OA's structure. It's the OA's vehicle for supporting local units. This session explores this relationship.

LODGE LEADERSHIP

- *The Dynamics of Leadership (Jerry Trier — Wahunsenakah)*
This session will focus on developing leadership styles and interpersonal skills.
- *So You Want to be a Leader in Your Lodge? (Section Chief Preston Marquis)*
This session looks further into developing good leadership habits by looking at the necessity of setting the example and how your example affects others.
- *Arrow Point: Lodge Meetings (Chief Danny Bonmizzio — Wahunsenakah)*
Share with other Arrowmen how to plan, conduct, and evaluate both interesting and effective meetings.
- *Working Together: Advisers Advisees (George Homewood — Wahunsenakah)*
One of the key aspects to the success of the lodge is the relationship between youth officers and adult advisers. Strong relationships and mutual understanding are very important.

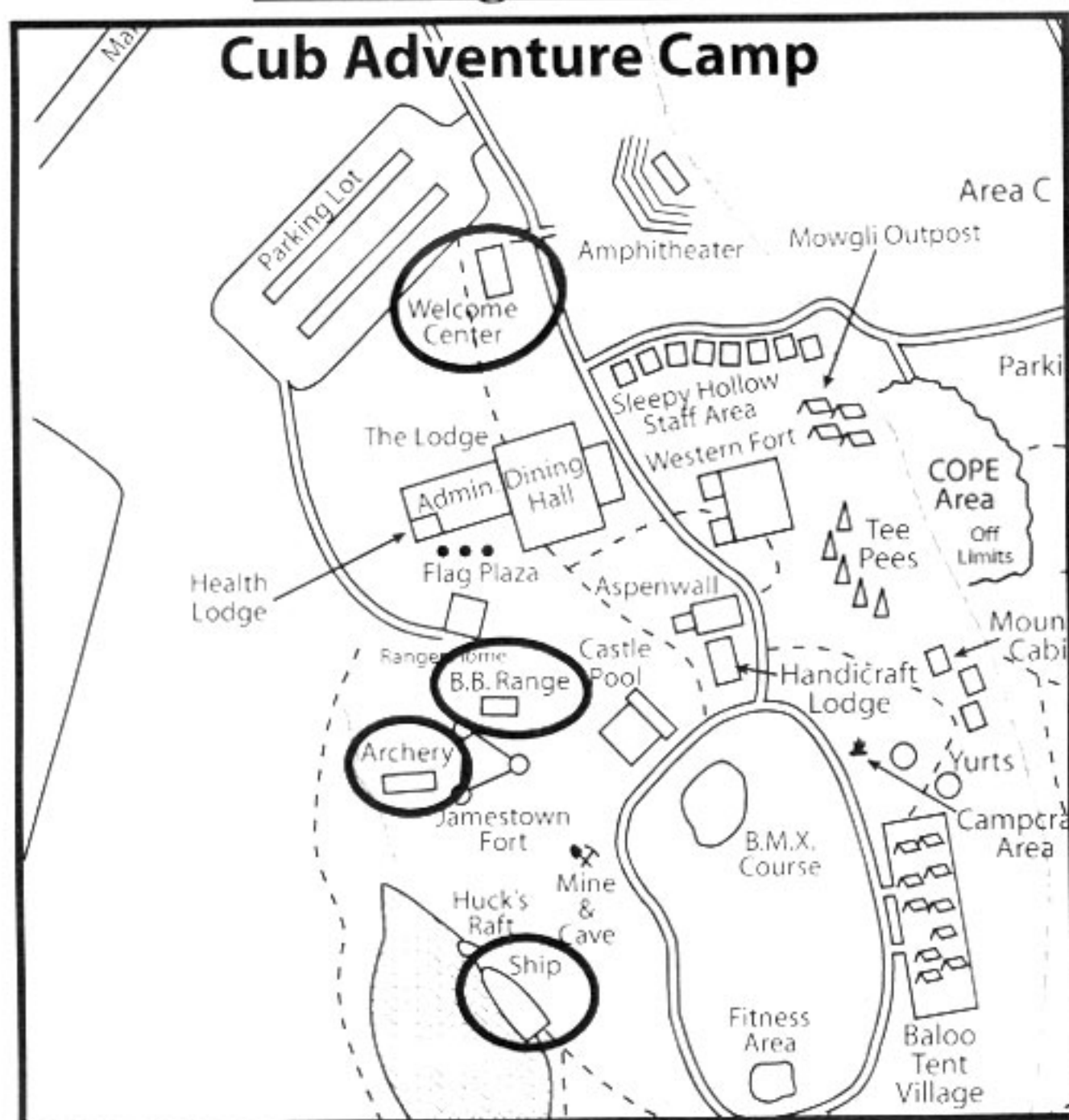

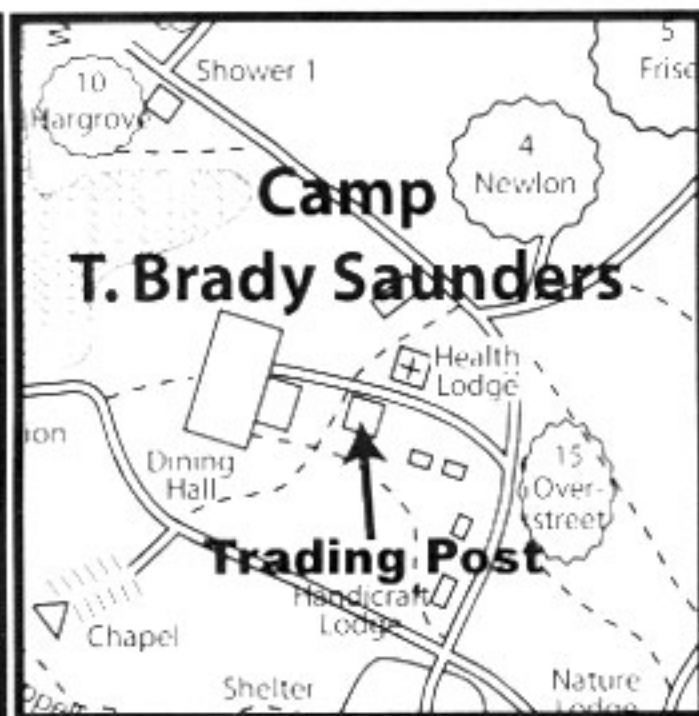
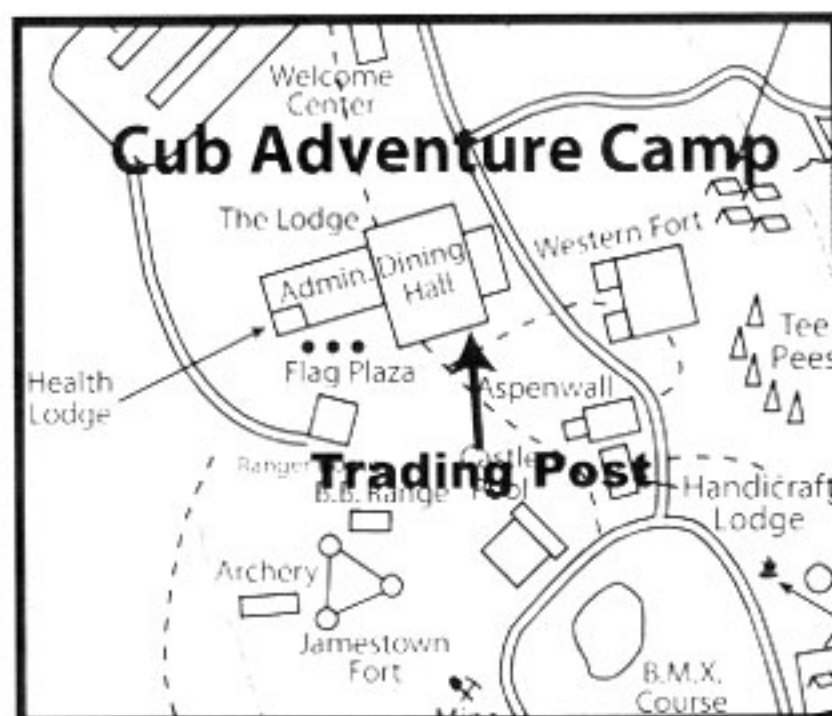
