
Welcome to Bayport!

Bayport Scout Reservation is a 306-acre camp with new facilities that are designed to give Scouts a unique blend of rustic camping and modern conveniences. The reservation is the dream outdoor class room, From 400 feet of sandy beach, a mill pond, pine groves, to hardwood areas, Bayport has something for everyone. The Birdsong Center is 16,000 square feet of air conditioned bliss in the center of camp that hosts our Quarterdeck (admin area), Northrop Grumman Galley (mess hall), Sick Bay, central bathrooms, and a Ship's Store.



Our high adventure programs are a tribute to our unique geographic location on McCann's Bay. The Rappahannock River is the most breathtaking feature of Bayport Scout Reservation. **Programs** feature sailing, motor boating, water skiing, wakeboarding, fishing, and a unique COPE and Climbing Program.

The reservation actually consists of two unique camps: Rappahannock Scout Camp is where you will be sleeping, eating, and doing most of your activities. Rivah Base will be hosting several special events, including the Polar Bear Plunge, Second Century Summit, Zip Line & Climbing Tower, Meal Kit Service Project, and the FireFest (show) followed by the Pig Roast.





SR-7A's 2015 Legacy Fellow is Mack Ruffin of Nawakwa Lodge 3, who has been a member of the Order of the Arrow for nearly 45 years.

Ruffin served as a Lodge Adviser for Nawakwa Lodge for more than a quarter of a century and he is an enthusiastic supporter of the Order of the Arrow on the lodge level and beyond. During Mack's tenure as Lodge Adviser, Nawakwa grew



from 398 members to a membership of over 1,100. The lodge received five E. Urner Goodman Camping Awards, three National Service Awards
