CODE OF CONDUCT

As a member of the Order of the Arrow, I will:

- 1. Observe the Scout Oath, Scout Law, and the Order of the Arrow Obligation.
- Wear my official Class A uniform when appropriate and Conclave identification throughout Conclave.
- 3. Attend activities and training opportunities.
- 4. Be personally responsible for breakage, damage, or loss of property.
- Not smoke inside any buildings and be advised of smoking regulations regarding adult smoking. No smoking is permitted under 18 years of age.
- 6. Respect all rules regarding vehicles in camp.
- 7. Not leave camp property without receiving proper permission.
- 8. Understand that the possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs at Conclave will not be permitted. Compliance with state laws and camp regulations will apply at all times.
- 9. At all times, be the considerate guest of a considerate camp host.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- All Arrowmen are expected to wear the complete BSA field (Class A) uniform during flag ceremonies, training, meals, and shows. Activity (Class B) uniforms may be worn to all other events.
- The camp Health Lodge will be staffed 24 hours a day by qualified first aid personnel. The Health Lodge is located beside the Trading Post and Burton Center.
- 3. Patch trading should not occur during training sessions or the show.
- 4. Any found items may be turned in at the Hospitality Tent in the parade field in front of the OA Shelter.
- 5. In the event of a camp-wide emergency, a siren will sound. At that time, all Arrowmen should assemble in their campsite to receive further instructions.
- 6. Neither Tidewater Council nor Blue Heron Lodge 349 will be held responsible for lost or stolen articles. Please lock your vehicles.


This year, the OA Museum, located in the **Gregson Center**, will showcase the fuel for SR-7A: its Arrowmen, lodges, and traditions. Highlights of the exhibits include a comprehensive collection of SR-7A memorabilia, a look at past conclave service projects, American Indian Activities (AIA), SR-7A-produced national officers, history of the section logo, and much more. The history of the service lodge, Blue Heron, will also be on display. Museum staff will interview past Section Officers and engage you, the museum's guest, to explore how you might shape the future of the section.



OA HIGH ADVENTURE AREA

Experience the sights, sounds, and smells of the Order of the Arrow's High Adventure programs, held every summer at Philmont, Northern Tier, the Summit, and the Florida Sea Base! Start off your Saturday with the Polar Bear Plunge at 8:30 am at the Waterfront (closed-toe shoes required). After breakfast join us for a session discussing packing for a high adventure trek and setting up a campsite in bear country; a session where Arrowmen will talk about their past experiences at the different

OAHA programs; and a guided hike through Pipsico. After lunch there will be Dutch oven cooking, branding, fire by friction demonstrations, the Flatland Bluegrass Band, and a fire where we can share stories about our High Adventure experiences. The Climbing Tower will be open in the morning and the afternoon for Arrowmen looking for a bird's eye view of Pipsico Scout Reservation.



The Troop Representative Summit is a top-notch, invitation-only training event for current Troop Representatives and Advisers which will equip these Arrowmen to improve the connections between their troop and lodge. The Summit will occur on Saturday morning at the K Building in Camp Kiwanis. All attendees should eat during the first breakfast shift (your nametag will give you permission to go to the front on the line) and then board a shuttle to the training location beginning at 7:20 am from the shuttle stop near the Burton Center.

AMERICAN INDIAN ACTIVITIES

American Indian Activities will be located at the Parade Field in the AIA area denoted on the Camp Lions map (pages 16-17) during Conclave 2017. Look for the tipis and be sure to stop by during the weekend.

Native American-related training sessions will be held at the AIA area on Saturday morning.

CEREMONIES

A Ceremonies Training session entitled "So You Want to be a Ceremonialist" will be held on Saturday from 9:00-9:50 am at the Scoutcraft shelter.

Ceremony evaluations will begin at 9:00 am and run through 5:00 pm on Saturday. All ceremony teams will be evaluated as Honor or Standard. Honor recognition will be in accordance with national guidelines. Teams are not evaluated against each other but rather against a national standard.

Specific ceremony evaluation times will be distributed at the Friday night Council of Chiefs meeting. You will check in at the Scoutcraft Shelter at least 15 minutes prior to your evaluation time slot. Confirm with your Lodge Chief for what time your lodge's ceremony team(s) will be evaluated.

Also, be sure to participate in the Ceremonies Roundtable at 10:00 pm on Saturday.

QUEST FOR THE GOLDEN ARROW

The competition for the GOLDEN ARROW Award will be based on a point scale. The lodge with the most points at the end of the competition will be the winner! The following five (5) events will comprise the GOLDEN ARROW competition during Conclave 2017:

Lodge Ball
Ultimate Frisbee
Volleyball
Tug of War
Fire Building

Each place in each event is worth the following amount of points. Fire Building will be worth double the amount of points as the other four (4) events:

- 1st = 100 points (Fire Building = 200 points)
- 2nd = 75 points (Fire Building = 150 points)
- 3rd = 50 points (Fire Building = 100 points)
- 4th = 25 points (Fire Building = 50 points)
- 5th and 6th place will receive no points except in Fire Building where 5th and 6th place are each worth 25 points

NOTE: To encourage lodge participation, an additional 500 points will be added to the score of all lodges that compete in all 5 of the Quest Events.

Complete rules for all Quest events were distributed to Lodge Chiefs prior to Conclave, they are on the SR-7A Website, and they are available from either the Quest CVC or Adviser.

Lodges are reminded of the following overall rules that apply to all Quest Events:

- If at any time during a competition a lodge is caught cheating, they will be automatically disqualified in that particular Quest Event.
- Cleats or other studded shoes are not permitted in any Quest Event. Failure to comply will result in immediate disqualification of the offending lodge in that Quest Event.
- A total of 100 points will be deducted from the total GOLD-EN ARROW competition score of any lodge that does not provide the requested number of judges.
- If a lodge has a question or concern about any ruling made by an event Judge, such concerns may only be voiced to the event Judge by the Lodge's Team Captain (i.e. no one besides the Team Captain should engage with an event Judge over any ruling).
- The Quest Conclave Vice Chief is ultimately in charge of all Quest Events.

LODGE AWARDS

There are 3 lodge awards up for grabs during Conclave. The awards will be presented during the Saturday night Show:

LODGE OF THE YEAR AWARD: The Lodge of the Year Award recognizes the most exceptional lodge in Section SR-7A. Lodges score themselves on criteria distributed prior to Conclave and earn points during Conclave for various objectives. The lodge that scores the most points will receive the Lodge of the Year recognition.

QUEST FOR THE GOLDEN ARROW: The Quest for the Golden Arrow trophy is presented to the lodge that earns the most cumulative points in competitions held during Saturday afternoon of Conclave. For each competition, points are awarded according to how a lodge places. The lodge earning the greatest overall score is declared the winner of the Quest for the Golden Arrow.

SPIRIT AWARD: The Spirit Award is presented to the lodge deemed to exhibit the most spirit at Conclave based on the following criteria:

 Creative and enthusiastic support of the Conclave program by the entire lodge.

Demonstration of Scouting spirit by the entire lodge (including each point of the Scout Law).

3. Proper uniforms worn when appropriate.

 Lodge commitment to providing a food item for the Saturday night feast.

The recipient of the Spirit Award will be selected on Saturday night before the show and the award will be presented during the show.

PARTICIPATION AWARD

The Participation Award was established to recognize those Arrowmen who participate fully in the Conclave 2017 experience. The Participation Award is a pin that accompanies your Conclave patch.

The awards will be available beginning Saturday afternoon at the Trading Post at no cost. Upon completing Parts I, II, and III of the requirements, take your Passport to the Trading Post to receive your Participation Pin.
